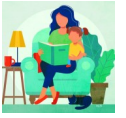

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time- Cycle C

A Family Perspective:

Today Jesus warns us his Word will create conflict between parents and children. In a permissive society which advocates individualism and consumerism, parents must continue to teach and live the gospel values of respect, service to others, forgiveness, generosity and compassion. A Christian family is a countercultural family.



Parenting Pointers:

“What’s so sacred about dinner? It happens every day. We face one another. We eat. We talk. It doesn’t matter that some of the talk is trivial or full of complaints. We share our day, warts and all. It doesn’t matter if the food is plain or even unappetizing. We have food. It doesn’t even matter if we come to the table angry with one another or if we get angry as a result of being together. We have to deal with the people who push our buttons – and then push beyond it. We might even find the grace to forgive.” (*Raising Kids Who Will Make a Difference* by Susan Vogt)

Working alongside the Bishop, the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth reinforces the ongoing implementation of policies and procedures that protect children. All clergy, employees, and volunteers in the Diocese of Erie who work with children must undergo criminal record checks. The diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children and Youth screening guidelines and abuse prevention training programs emphasize the importance of knowing the employees and volunteers who have access to children in our schools and parishes. Parents should remain vigilant in insisting that those with access to their children have gone through an application process and obtained the required clearances and trainings before being granted access to their children.

Dear Parishioners

You may not have known this but... last week we had several interesting days in St. Marys with regard to clergy presence. With one priest out of town and another ill, there was just one priest available, sort of. We were blessed to have a couple of Benedictine priests in town trying to enjoy time away from their assignments. They willingly pitched in when available for Masses. Still, there were some hours with NO priest available in case of sick calls or emergencies. It was a true scramble to find priests to cover the weekend Masses. One priest traveled 50 miles to help out, only to rush back home for a Mass; another hurried through his own parish Masses to get here afterward. We came very close to cancelling Masses. Neither the Archabbey nor the diocese had priests available to send for help. I share this with you to let you know the current state of clergy availability. This is the direction we are headed! At the funeral of every priest, Bishop Persico asks the congregation, "Who will take his place?" as he then invites us to pray for vocations. The hard truth of the answer to that question is that there are very few coming along in preparation for priesthood – it is quite likely there will be no one to take that place. What might change that? Prayer? I hope so. How about some action? How about raising our children and grandchildren in the faith -- bringing them to church, so that some might have the opportunity to hear God's call? How about encouraging young men and women whom you know to consider a church vocation? How about Confirmation not being the end of faith formation, but a new beginning? Our community takes great pride in Ben and Luke Dagher, two outstanding young men, as well we should. But if they are the only two young people in this community responding to a church vocation, God is not doing His job very well. Oh, wait a minute. Is it possible that God is still at work, and we are not doing our part? Which is more likely the case? Who will take *my* place? The answer, quite possibly, is no one. Not that I'm irreplaceable, believe me. That's just our reality, until we all do something about it. We are coming perilously closer to a Church without sufficient clergy.
