Read Sunday's Gospel, Lk 9: 51-62

**THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME -
Cycle C**

Gospel Summary:

And to another he said, "Follow me." In every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling us. We can easily get distracted and not hear it or simply ignore it, pretending it wasn't even heard. When we do hear it and favorably respond, there are some conditions that must be met. Jesus makes it clear that once we say yes to his invitation, we must stay focused and forge ahead. We cannot keep looking behind or worry about unfinished business. There are some tasks, and discipleship is one, that require our full devotion.

There are many "masters" vying for our attention. We need something or someone to give us direction. Human nature requires it. Our motives and actions reveal what has our allegiance. It is tempting to give ourselves to masters that lure us with intriguing promises. When given the choice between a "master" that promises worldly success, abundant wealth, status, privilege, and security versus a "master" that asks for self-sacrifice, hardship, suffering, ridicule, and death, to whom do we go? While the promise of immediate pleasure is enticing, there is always a catch. For all that secular masters can promise, they always keep us looking behind, checking on ourselves, second guessing choices, calculating options, and being slaves to excessive worry. Our guard can never come down. Only one master really promises life: Jesus Christ. Hearing his call, we either trust him or we don't.

Saying yes to following Christ does come with a risk. But it also comes with the brightness of future hopes and dreams. There is no need to keep looking behind. Sins are forgiven and regrets serve no effective purpose. God is not there. He's moved beyond all that stuff. God is in the today and the tomorrow and what he can continually do with our daily affirmation to follow Him. All we need to do is be obedient. St. Gianna Molla is credited with saying, "The stillness of prayer is the most essential condition for fruitful action. Before all else, the disciple kneels down." Begin with prayer. We will not only hear God's call but find the courage to trust that He will guide us where we need to be. God uses us in the most ordinary of ways through the simple daily expression of our lives.

Dear Parishioners,

I'm writing this a few days after a major storm blew through our area. The entire town was without electricity for at least several hours. For some, it was longer. The winds were fierce. Trees fell. The lightening was sharp; the thunder crackled. Rain water came like a wall, reminding me of what the Red Sea must have looked like as it crashed back in on the Egyptians. Within a few hours, there was calm. By the next morning, a new day broke open like a splendid summer day: sunshine, no humidity, a few clouds, a slight breeze, a moderate temperature. The storm, then, was a line of demarcation. On the front side, chaos. On the backside, beauty. And there you have it, a meteorological lesson for us. We live in and with a lot of chaos. Perhaps it has always been so, but it sure seems like we have an abundance in our time. It puts me in mind of the "storms" of the 60s – the protests, the anger, the marches, the "establishment" vs. the "new generation." We survived them. By the 80s, we were a fairly calm society, embracing changes, both abrupt and gradual. Some for the good; some not. The storm front has to come through. The line of demarcation has to be crossed. Perhaps we will appreciate new blessings, new vision, new opportunity, new perspective. The world still marches to the tune of what we Christians call the "*Paschal Mystery*." More often than not, I refer to it as the "*Saving Mystery*," because most people don't use our vocabulary anymore. Jesus passed from death to life. This is not just for Lent or Easter. His saving actions give us the pattern by which all the world, all people, and all of creation come to know redemption. Some people will say they "love" storms. Not me. But I have survived many. And so I trust that we will get through them to an "other" side. Let us hope and pray that the divisions of our time – in the world, in politics, in the church, in families, will pass, even if the going gets really rough. The grace of new life awaits. Maybe, for starters, we could just keep one another safe in the storms. By reaching out to help whomever we can help. By praying for safety, for strength, and for resolutions. By trusting in the Providence and power of God. "*Your Father knows what you need before you ask*," Jesus said.
