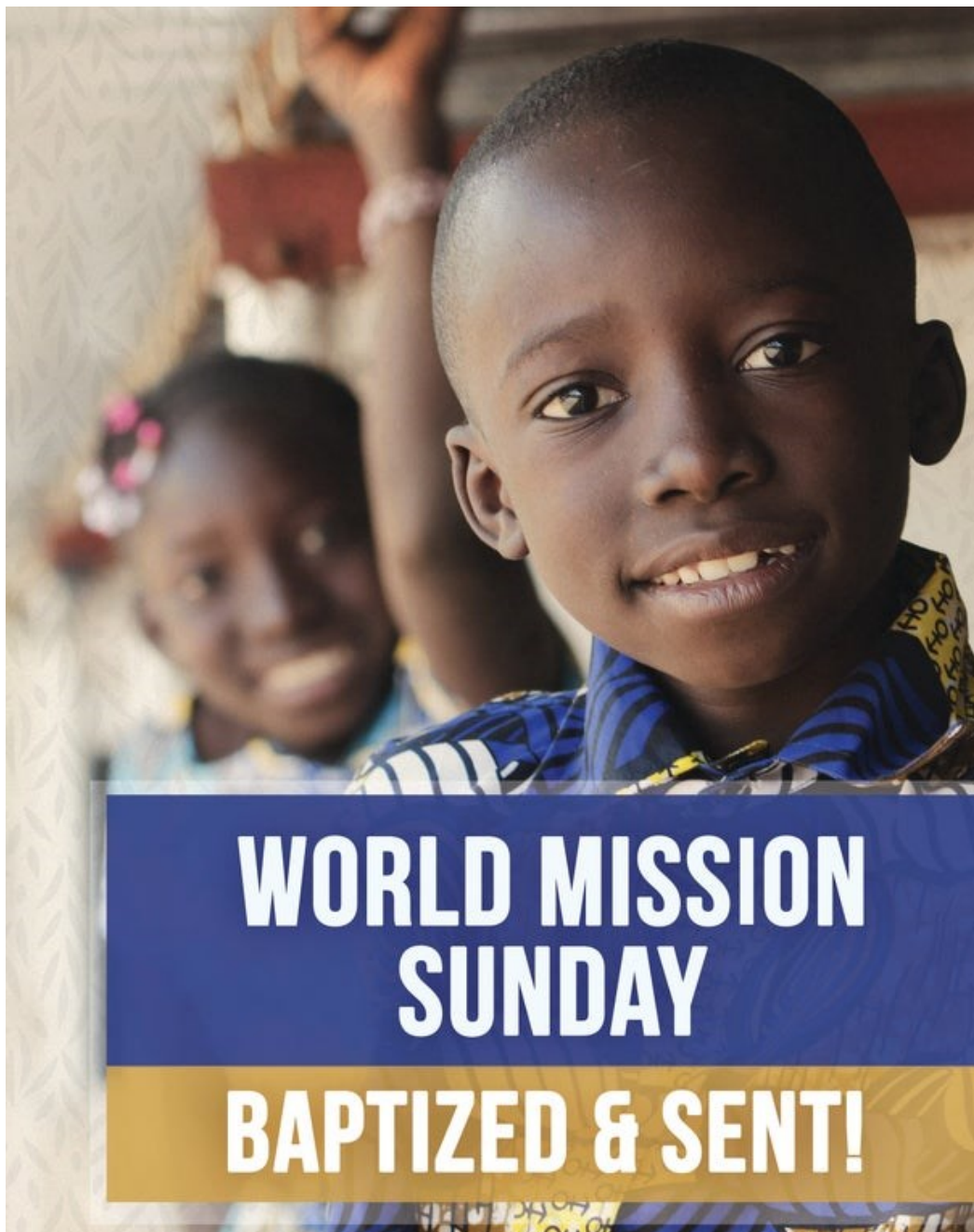

Dear Parishioners

Our children are “ramping it up” this week getting ready for their big celebration next Monday. Halloween has become second only to Christmas in

our time. Already, for weeks, our little ones have been planning their costumes, their trick-or-treat routes, and their parties with jubilant excitement. There are some in the Christian culture that are anti-Halloween, based on its delving into darkness and death. We need not be among them. The feast comes from our own church calendar, the “Eve” of the “Holy Ones.” Centuries ago, the belief was that we could dance, celebrate and rejoice in the face of darkness, death and evil. Why? Because the victory has been won! Because the next day we honor the Lord of all the holy ones who have already won the battle and live with Him forever. Halloween became a kind of mocking of the power of death, because it “has no more power...” as the Scriptures say. This “spirit” is also celebrated at Mardi Gras in New Orleans and various places, with songs, parades, and feasts. So, go ahead and rejoice in our children’s excitement. Join them in revelry. But, also point them in the direction of goodness and grace. Remind them that there are certain things even better and more important than this day, such as Christmas and Easter – those days that are our most important ones. Encourage them to have “disguises” that focus more on joy, goodness, life, and humor rather than the dark, gory features of evil. After all, it is true that the more we open the door toward evil, the more the Evil One will take advantage to enter. So, like all things, we do Halloween with care and perspective. Just maybe, we can translate all the joy, excitement, and energy toward something such as Mass, a true celebration of the fullness of the Life which has conquered the night.

### PREPARING TO VOTE

There are so many issues in the political sphere. No one party or candidate can be endorsed by the Church. “Voter’s Guides” are typically slanted from some perspective, leaving other important issues without proper consideration. We are clearly told as a Catholic institution that only Guides that are approved by the Bishops, the Diocese, or the PA Catholic Conference can be placed in Church or distributed on its property. Currently, no such guide exists. Frankly, no such candidate exists! The best we can do is pray and “discern,” -- see corresponding notice. Spend the time between now and Election doing your homework about the candidates and the issues and ask the Lord’s guidance. In conscience, we do our best to vote for those who are best suited, but certainly not perfect.

### STAY STRONG REGGIE!

Recently, we learned that instead of a “typical” childhood leukemia, Reggie’s is a more rare type that changes his treatment plan drastically. For the next 8 weeks, Reggie, along with his Mom and Dad alternating turns, will be staying in Pittsburgh for his very intense chemo treatment.
