Gospel Summary & Question of the Week

Read Sunday's Gospel, Lk 17: 11—19

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time- Cycle C

A Family Perspective:

Everyone has been where the lepers are in today's gospel: they meant to thank Jesus for a blessing, but, excited about being cured they just didn't get 'around-to-it.' We too get caught up in our own interests and fail to appreciate what we have or what has been done for us. This week, take nothing for granted and get around to thanking those who deserve your thanks.

Parenting Pointers:

Dear Parishioners



Within the next few days we have two very special opportunities to reflect on the Eucharist. Tuesday evening's session on the Second Vatican Council will look at the Constitution on the Liturgy and the Mass we celebrate. Next weekend, we will celebrate Sunday Mass with the theme of the Eucharist. So, spend some time this week pondering your experience of this greatest gift of the Lord and the Church. What about Mass excites you? What does it mean to you that the Lord is as present to us now as He was when He walked this earth? How has your "Communion" with the Lord walked you through good times and bad times? How do you express your devotion to Eucharist, your gratitude for Eucharist? Have you missed the opportunity to drink the Precious Blood? What keeps you away from Eucharist? What draws you toward the Eucharist? Has it been a while since you've studied Mass? Come and join us Tuesday evening for a bit of a refresher. As a pop quiz, let me ask: Can you name the parts of the Mass? What are acclamations? Why is posture an expression of our prayer? As Catholics, our lifetime is expressed in the Eucharist. We celebrate Mass regularly. Sometimes, we look forward to special moments, such as Baptisms, Confirmation, Weddings, and special occasions when we gather as family and parish family. Sometimes the Mass consoles us by its regular pattern and its promise to be a prayer of comfort and help. When we are mourning or in need of help, it is the best way for us to turn to the Lord in prayer. For a gazillion reasons, the Mass is the greatest mystery of faith that we have. Let's take advantage of these two opportunities this week to let the Lord's True Presence sink that much further into our very being. Maybe you can share with someone what Eucharist means to you.
