## Gospel Summary & Question of the Week

Read Sunday's Gospel, Lk 16: 1-13

### Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time- Cycle C

**A Family Perspective:**

Despite all our time saving gadgets, we still have less leisure and family time. To solve this we created the Myth of Quality Time. Don't be fooled: Quality Time is Quantity Time. Jesus counsels us today, we "cannot serve two masters" and expect to be happy. Dedicate time to your family. No one in their final hours regretted not spending more time at work.

**Parenting Pointers:**

"There was a rich man...and lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus." (Luke 16:19-20) Is your family rich or poor? It probably depends on who you compare yourself to. Talk with your child about how you might help someone poorer than you.

**Marriage Moment:**

"It is my wish that...all should pray...without anger or argument." (1 Timothy 2:8). I don't know of any marriage that has not had time(s) of anger or argument. Can you remember your last argument? Is it time to ask for forgiveness, pray, and let it go?



### WHERE HAVE ALL THE CHOIRS GONE?
