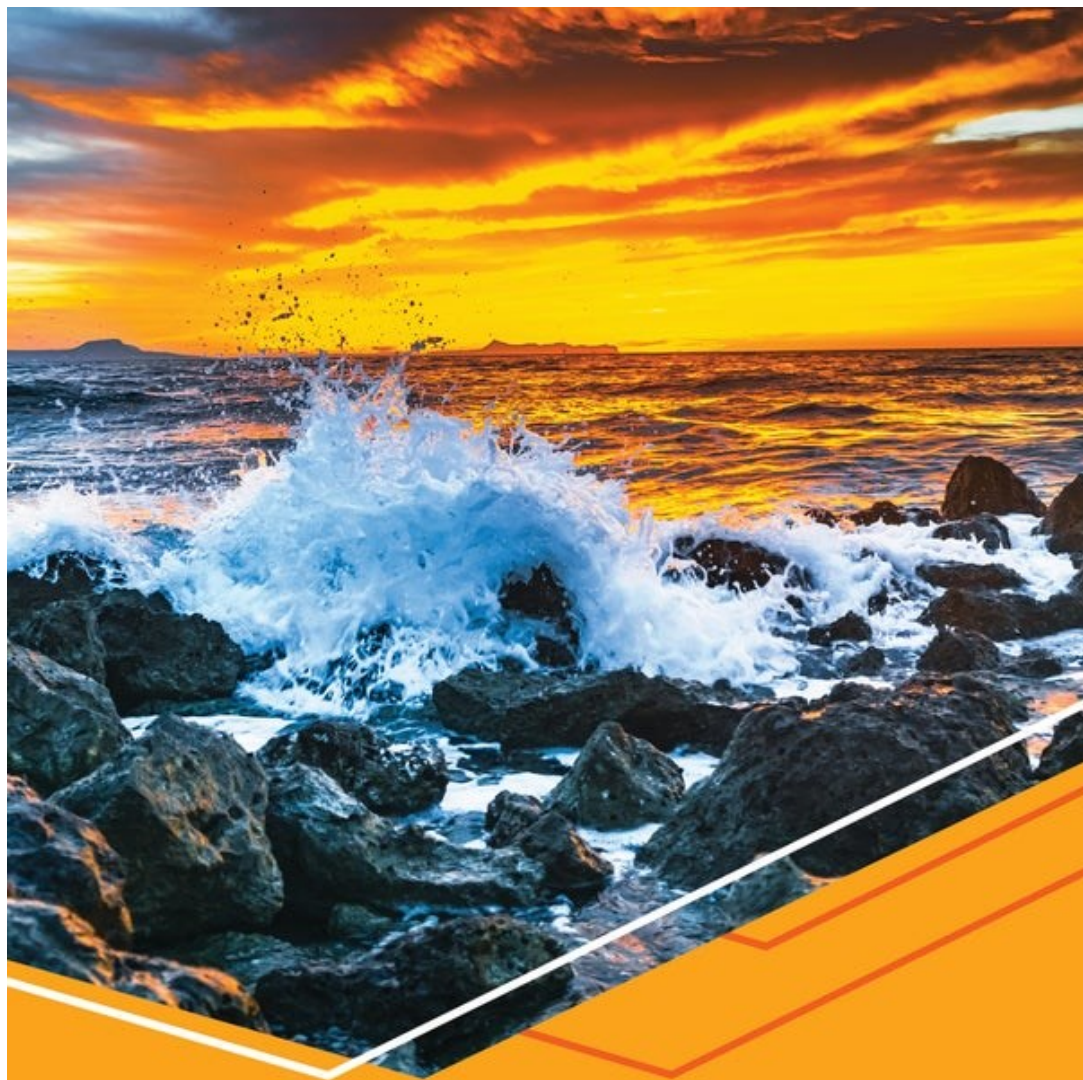

**Gospel Summary & Question of the Week**  
Read Sunday's Gospel, Lk 16: 19-31

**Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time- Cycle C**

**A Family Perspective:**

In today's gospel the rich man died and was condemned to "a place of torment" because he ignored the poor. He asked Lazarus to go and warn his five brothers to change their ways. Evidently ignoring the poor was a family pattern. What is your family's attitude toward those who are poor?

**Parenting Pointers:**

Is your child a "neatnik" or a "clutter-bug"? The latter is usually harder to live with. Is it time to negotiate age appropriate clean-up practices? Everyone old enough to walk can share in making a household a home. Got this covered? Good. If not, call a Family Meeting.

**Marriage Moment:**

"Woe to the complacent..." (Amos 6: 1) Sometimes in marriage we settle into a comfortable routine – Fine. But sometimes that routine morphs into boredom. Dear Parishioners



If someone says “Happy New Year” to you early this week, don’t be too terribly surprised. Our Jewish brothers and sisters will be celebrating Rosh Hashana, the beginning of the New Year. The Hebrew Scriptures dictate for the people of the First Covenant when and how to celebrate New Year. So, for two days this week they pray, reflect, and eat certain celebratory foods. This helps them reflect on the blessings of the past and look forward to the future. They will then spend a few more days in deeper reflection preparing for Yom Kippur, the day of atonement. So, these are scared times for those who handed on to us the beginnings of faith. Remember that many of our beliefs and traditions, our prayers and hopes, are based on the foundation of God’s covenant relationship with the Chosen People. This alone is one reason to join us in study of the Second Vatican Council. There, the Church changed its attitude and approach to the Jewish faith and the Jewish people. In fact, Jewish leaders were invited to attend the Council – a first for the Church since the days of Saint Paul! We celebrate our own “New Year” in Advent, and typically do this more commonly on January 1<sup>st</sup>. But, any time is a good time to see the “newness” of God’s world – a new day, a new time, a new way of recognizing our place in God’s heart and plan. What new beginning would serve you well? What reflection on the past would help you learn and let go? What kind of prayer and celebration might you make to enjoy a “fresh start” in some aspect of your life? “Happy New Year” indeed! As the Scriptures say, “*Now is the day of salvation!*” Begin again in any way that you need to. It’s a good time to do just that – TODAY!
